<p>On Line Safety: Pupils learn about how to keep personal information private, recognising that the extent to which they need to protect their privacy is determined by the audience to which they are exposed. In preparing their eBooks, pupils could make use of the school's photo collection – this provides a good opportunity to teach them about what images the school collects and their use. Pupils learn to use audio recorders or microphones and audio recording software safely and sensibly. Pupils learn that filters should be in place when searching for images on the web. Internet access is supervised and safe practices are encouraged. Pupils need to be aware of copyright material and show appropriate respect for the owners of intellectual property when using technology. They learn about the issues around copying images without permission and that it is best to use Creative Commons licensed or public domain images.</p>

To search a picture library on the internet to add further images to their eBook, and learn about copyright and what to do if they see inappropriate images when searching.	Children are able to select appropriate images from the internet to insert in their eBook.
