<p>On Line Safety: Pupils learn about Internet filters and Safe search, and how to stay safe while researching online. They are encouraged to think about whether the information they read online is reliable, and develop some strategies for being able to check. They show respect for others' ideas and intellectual property by using Creative Commons licensed images and crediting their sources.</p>
