<p>On Line Safety: Pupils create a school magazine or yearbook. They consider carefully the implications of including photographs of pupils in their work, recognising that typically names would not be used in captions and that they should have permission to publish any pictures they use. They respect school policies and relevant legislation. They also recognise that intellectual property exists in other pupils' work and that this should be respected, so include such excerpts only with permission. They also learn that sensitive personal information should not be included in publications such as these, thinking carefully about what this means in practice.</p>
